

(2) Special Categories.

- (a) Special categories of children with HIV infection are reported to the local health department by their health care providers. These include: (1) all children less than six years of age; (2) children under 21 years of age whose providers have reasonable grounds to believe that they present special risks to other children or to adults in an educational setting (e.g., an ongoing history of biting others, scratching, spitting and those who have uncoverable, oozing lesions (a more restrictive educational environment may be advisable to minimize exposure of other children to blood or body fluids)); and (3) all children diagnosed with AIDS.
- (b) Individuals diagnosed with HIV infections, AIDS and HBV carriers are covered under the Americans with Disabilities Act, and so must receive appropriate accommodations.
- (3) <u>Students with a Confirmed/Suspected Diagnosis</u>. If the Building Administrator has information that leads him/her to suspect that a student may be infected with HIV, HBV or HCV, the following steps shall be taken:
