SCHOOL BUILDING IMPROVEMENT BOND

What This Means for Students and Staff :

Classes will need to move between the existing buildings, temporary classrooms, and the new facility as it is constructed. The project team will be in constant communication with staff to minimize disruption to teachers and students to the extent feasible.

Theater and Performing Arts

For the 2015-16 school year, drama classes will be held in a general education classroom. Performances will take place at locations to be determined. In the fall of 2016, drama and music classes will move into the new theater building.

Sports and PE

For the 2015-16 school year, PE classes will be held in the heated tent structure and interim weight room. Athletics staff is reviewing alternative locations for basketball practice and games for the 2015-16 school year. Please consult with your coach for the latest information. In the fall of 2016, the new gymnasium building will open and all gym-based sports will have their new home.

The football field and track will remain open during construction. However, there will be some impacts - construction fencing will restrict access to the entrance on N. Burr Avenue. Bathrooms in the grandstand will be inaccessible, but there will be portable toilets north of the concession stand. The training room and first aid supplies will be relocated to the concessions shed.

Baseball, tennis, and softball will be impacted for the full two-year construction period. Please consult with your coach for the latest information on practice and game locations.

Student Health Center

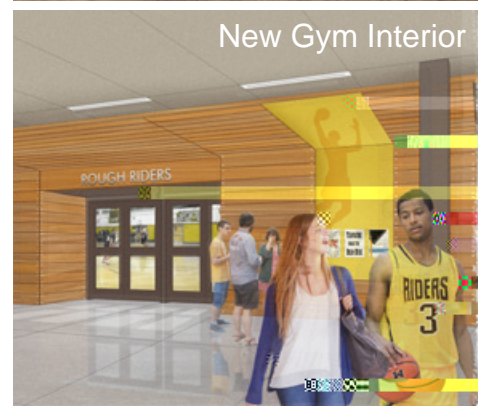
